2023 SELECTED PROJECTS

Norwalk: Stokeley Park Revitalization

Work in a supporting role with Norwalk Park & Rec to revitalize Stokeley Park. This project will include purchasing two (2) youth soccer goals, a discover cave, a gaga ball pit, one (1) basketball hoop with concrete, and one (1) bench.

\$15,000.00

Willard: Willard City Park Revitalization

Work in a supporting role with Willard Park & Rec to revitalize Willard City Park. This project will include purchasing a replacement slide for the current out-of-regulation play piece. **\$15,000.00**

All-Huron County: Greenwich Reservoir Park Revitalization

Work in a supporting role with the Greenwich Improvement Group/ the Village of Greenwich to improve the state of Reservoir Park. This project will include purchasing a new slide for the current play structure, topsoil to fix the space between the slides and ground level, and possibly a new ADA-compliant swing set. **\$15,000+**

- Huron County Community Foundation Grant

The community foundation encourages proposals for projects that collaborate among Huron County organizations, build organizational capacity, leverage additional resources, demonstrate sustainability, and address community needs. The minimum grant awards are \$1,000, with a general range of \$1,000 to \$5,000, and are typically awarded for one year only. Grant projects must serve Huron County residents.

TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES / NEW RESOURCES

- SNAP-Ed Toolkit Evidence-Based Interventions

The SNAP-Ed Toolkit recently added 13 new evidence-based interventions and 3 new resources for SNAP-Ed Implementing Agencies to explore. In Spring 2022, three peer experts completed reviews of each intervention to assure alignment with SNAP-Ed goals and evaluation indicators and review supporting evidence for intervention effectiveness.

This toolkit contains evidence-based strategies, resources, and case study examples to give park and recreation professionals ideas and guidance to advance parks and recreation as Community Wellness Hubs. It provides a process guide to creating a Community Wellness Hub in alignment with the seven dimensions of well-being. The toolkit is based on an evaluation of 15 local park and recreation agencies that planned, developed, and created wellness hubs between 2020 and 2022.
